Step 1: Collect Leaves and Petals

- Niklas Luhmann Reference:
- Luhmann grouped his ideas into themes. For kids, this means collecting natural elements like leaves and petals to inspire their cards.

For Kids:

• 60 outside and collect some leaves and flowers. These will help you create a card about nature! Maybe it's the kindergarten's magical garden Where children play and learn. Tip:

• Take your leaves and petals and glue them onto a blank card or piece of paper. This is your nature card you can call it "The Magical Garden" or whatever you like.

Step 3: Adding a Title and Explanation

<u>Step 2: Creating your Card</u>

Tip:

- With your parent's help, give your card a title. You can also write a sentence explaining what the nature elements represent. For example:
- "This is the magical garden where children can lear about plants and nature."

Example Card for Inspiration:

- Title: The Magical Garden
- Materials: Leaves, petals, and small flowers.
- Explanation: "This garden is where children in the kindergarten learn about plants from all over the world."

<u>Magic Sentence for Kids:</u>

"Today, my magic sentence is: The garden is my favorite classroom!"

<u>Reward Mechanism for Motivation:</u>
