This card arrangement is inspired by Niklas Luhmann's note-taking method, and we encourage you to create your own cards in each row. A3.005: Text Explanation – Adding Depth and Context

Story Script (Introduction for Parents and Children):

This attachment card encourages children to explain their drawings in writing. Just like Luhmann added detailed explanations to his cards, kids can learn to add context and depth to their dream kindergarten ideas.

Step 1: Drawing the Idea

Tip:

- Draw a new idea for your dream kindergarten. Maybe it's the music room where children sing and dance. After drawing the idea, it's time to explain what makes this place special!

Step 2: Writing the Explanation

Tip:

- With the help of a parent, write a few sentences describing the music room. For example: "This is the music room where kids sing, play instruments, and dance to their favorite songs!"



Example Card for Inspiration:

- Title: The Music Room
- Drawing: Children playing instruments and dancing in a colorful music room.
- Explanation: "This is the happiest room in the kindergarten, where children sing, play, and dance all day."

Magic Sentence for Kids:

"Today, my magic sentence is: I can explain my ideas through words and drawings!"

Reward Mechanism for Motivation:

- Weekly: After writing an explanation for one card each day for a week, your child can earn a Music Star sticker.
- Monthly: After completing 30 text explanations, your child earns the Master Writer badge.
- 180 Days: After explaining 180 cards, your child receives the "Kindergarten Story Writer" Award for adding depth to their ideas!



Tips for Parents:

- Help your child write a short explanation for each card.
- Encourage your child to describe what makes their drawing special and how it fits into the dream kindergarten.
