

We're now organizing HUNTER'S CARDSET using the letters M.A.T.R.I.X. Each letter has four rows—M1, M2, M3, M4—and each row contains seven sub-cards, labeled M1.001, M1.002, M1.003, and so on up to M1.007. This card arrangement is inspired by Niklas Luhmann's note-taking method, and we encourage you to create your own cards in each row. Download the 7 cards from the link below, and let's build them together!



A3.007: Linking and Organizing Cards – Evolving Ideas with Luhmann's Method

Story Script (Introduction for Parents and Children):
This final attachment card will teach children how to link their ideas together, just like Niklas Luhmann did. By organizing their cards and creating connections between them, children will understand how each part of their dream kindergarten fits together.

Step 1: Drawing the Cards

Tip:

- Draw a new set of cards. For example, you might draw the lunchroom, the art room, and the library. Each of these cards represents a different part of the kindergarten, but now we'll learn how to connect them.

Step 2: Linking the Cards

Tip:

- Use arrows, colors, or stickers to link your cards. For example, you could link the art room to the library because both places encourage creativity. Add arrows or lines connecting the two cards to show how the ideas are related.

Step 3: Writing Explanations

Tip:

- With your parent's help, write a short sentence explaining how the two cards are connected. For example: "The art room and the library are both places where children use their imaginations to create and learn!"

Example Card for Inspiration:

- Card 1.001: The Art Room
- Card 1.002: The Library
- Link: "Both are places where children can explore their imagination and creativity."
- Drawing: An arrow linking the art room card to the library card with colorful lines or stickers to show the connection.

Magic Sentence for Kids:

"Today, my magic sentence is: My ideas are all connected, just like my cards!"



Reward Mechanism for Motivation:

- **Weekly:** After linking and organizing one set of cards each day for a week, your child earns a Linking Star sticker.
- **Monthly:** After completing 30 linked cards, your child receives the Master Connector badge.
- **180 Days:** At the end of 180 days, after creating and linking their dream kindergarten, your child is awarded the "Kindergarten Architect Award" for mastering the process of connecting ideas!

Tips for Parents:

- Help your child organize their cards and link related ideas together.
- Encourage them to think about how each part of their dream kindergarten is connected, building a full picture of how everything fits.

Conclusion:

By learning how to link and organize their cards, children develop the skill of seeing how different ideas are connected. This method helps them understand that their dream kindergarten is a complete system of related ideas, all working together.
