A4.005: Building a Dream Team – No Dream is Too Big with Friends by Your Side!

Story Script (for Parents and Children):

Listen up, Dream Captains! Every great adventure needs a team of awesome helpers. You may be a super-dreamer, but even superheroes have sidekicks, right? Batman has Robin, and you've got your very own Dream Team! This card is all about gathering the coolest, funniest, and most imaginative team to help make your dream come true.

Key Message:

"With your dream team by your side, there's no challenge too big and no dream too wild!"

The best part about building a dream is that you don't have to do it alone! You can get help from friends, family, or even magical creatures that live inside your imagination. Together, your team will take your dream to the next level.





Step-by-Step Activity:

1. **Choose Your Dream Team:** Ask your child: "Who do you want on your dream team?" They can choose real people like friends, parents, or even their favorite pet. Or, they can pick imaginary characters like talking dragons or flying puppies! It's all up to them!
 - **Example:** Hunter's Dream Team included his best friend, his little sister, and a wise old owl who gave the best advice.
 - **Tip:** Let your child go wild with their choices. Maybe their dream team includes a superhero, a pirate, and a talking sandwich. The more creative, the better!
2. **Create Dream Team Cards:** Once they've chosen their team, it's time to make Dream Team Cards for each member. Each card can have the person's name and a drawing of them, plus a little description of how they'll help make the dream come true.
 - **Example:** Hunter's sister was "The Animal Whisperer" who could talk to all the creatures in his dream school. The wise owl was "The Master Problem Solver."
 - **Tip:** Let your child think about each team member's special power—whether it's real or imagined.





3. Team Up for Success: Now that the team is ready, how will they help with the dream? Maybe one person builds the dream castle, while another makes sure it's stocked with snacks. Work together to think of all the ways this team can help the dream grow!

- Example: Hunter's Dream Team built the classrooms in the trees, while the talking owl made sure every room had magical books that taught the kids how to fly.
- Tip: Ask your child fun questions like, "What's the first thing your team will do to help your dream come true?" or "Who's in charge of making sure everyone has fun?"

Magic Sentence Template:

Here's your Dream Team's magic phrase:

- "With my Dream Team by my side, we can do anything!"

Say it with your team! Whether you're with real friends or imaginary ones, you'll feel unstoppable with this phrase.





Inspiration Story:

Hunter was a dreamer with big ideas, but he knew he couldn't do it all alone. So, he created a Dream Team! His sister, always up for an adventure, became the Animal Whisperer who could communicate with all the magical creatures in the forest. Reflection Time for Parents:

Reward Mechanism for Motivation:

Let's give your Dream Team some high-fives with these fun rewards!

- Weekly: After a week of building and working with their Dream Team, reward your child with a "Dream Team Captain" sticker.
- Monthly: After 30 days of teamwork, reward them with a "Master of Teamwork" badge.
- 180 Days: After 6 months of Dream Team action, celebrate with a special "Ultimate Dream Team Leader" award, honoring their awesome leadership and teamwork!





Tips for Parents:

- Encourage your child to include both real and imaginary people on their Dream Team. Whether it's a best friend, a family member, or a superhero, anyone can help make their dream come true!
- Use teamwork as a fun way to get involved in your child's dream-building process. Ask them how you can be part of the team, too!
