A4.006: Reflecting on Progress and Growth – Look How Far You've Come!

Story Script (for Parents and Children):

You've been working so hard, and your dream is growing bigger every day. Now it's time to see how far you've come! Sometimes, the best way to move forward is to take a look back and give yourself a big pat on the back (or a high-five, or maybe even a victory dance!).





Step-by-Step Activity:

1. **Look Back at your Dream:** Pull out all the cards, drawings, and ideas you've made so far. Lay them out and take a good look. Isn't it AMAZING to see all the pieces of your dream coming together? Ask your child: "What's your favorite part of your dream so far?"
 - **Example:** Hunter looked back at his dream kindergarten and was super proud of the floating playground he had created with his team.
 - **Tip:** Make this moment special! Maybe play some fun music or dance around the room while you reflect on all the amazing progress.
2. **Before and After:** Now, think about how your dream has changed from the very beginning. Was there something you added that made it even better? Was there something you learned that helped your dream grow? Write or draw how your dream has transformed!
 - **Example:** Hunter's original dream was just a simple forest school, but now it had talking animals, magical classrooms, and flying chairs!
 - **Tip:** Encourage your child to draw a "Before" and "After" version of their dream to see how much it's grown.





3. Celebrate your Growth: It's time for a big celebration! You've come so far, and that deserves a HUGE round of applause. Have your child create a "Progress Card" showing off what they're most proud of in their dream journey.

- Example: Hunter made a special card that said "Master of Magical Classrooms" to celebrate his creativity in designing the coolest classrooms ever!
- Tip: Create a fun "Reflection Party" where you and your child celebrate everything they've created. Balloons, confetti, or even a special treat—it's time to celebrate!

Magic Sentence Template:

Let's celebrate that growth with this magic sentence:

- "Look how far I've come! My dream is growing, and so am I!"

Say it with a smile (and maybe a little dance) to remind your child that every step forward is something to be proud of.
