Location: Morgan Family Living Room, Tippecanoe & Local Community Center,

Montpellier

Characters: The Morgan family - Kate (Mother), Dave (Father), Ella (5 years old)

Plot Summary:

It was a rainy Saturday afternoon in Tippecanoe, and Ella was feeling a bit restless. "Let's make puppets and put on a show!" said Kate, pulling out a box of craft supplies. Ella's eyes lit up, and she quickly decided to make a "Puppy Princess" puppet, complete with a sparkly paper crown and floppy felt ears. Experiment Objective:

4. Data Recording:

- The family also used the *Puppet Pals* app to recreate the story digitally, letting
 Ella move the characters around on the screen and add her own voice to
 each one. It was a fun way to revisit the story and add new twists.
- At the local Community Center in Montpellier, families were invited to bring their puppets and perform mini-shows. Ella proudly brought The Puppy Princess, and she was thrilled when other kids joined in, creating their own puppets and adding new characters to the story.

5. **Results:**

- Observations: Ella learned how to design and build characters, using her imagination to create unique puppets. She gained confidence by performing her story play, and she loved the idea of making new characters to add to future stories.
- Conclusion: Through this activity, Ella developed creativity, storytelling skills, and the ability to express herself confidently. The puppet-making process was engaging and playful, and it allowed her to explore different roles, voices, and dialogues. The collaborative aspect helped build teamwork, as the family worked together to create a fun, cohesive story.

Core Plot:
