M3.003: Smell

- Title: "What Would We Smell Here?"
- Imagination: Now take a deep breath with me—what's that wonderful smell? It's the scent of freshly baked bread coming from the kitchen, mixed with the sweet fragrance of flowers blooming in the garden. Every classroom has a different smell—one room smells like the citrusy freshness of a craft project, another like the warm vanilla of a storytime session where kids sip on hot cocoa. The playground smells of fresh grass after the morning dew, and you can even catch a whiff of the earth as the kids dig in the garden. Isn't it amazing how every smell tells a story?
